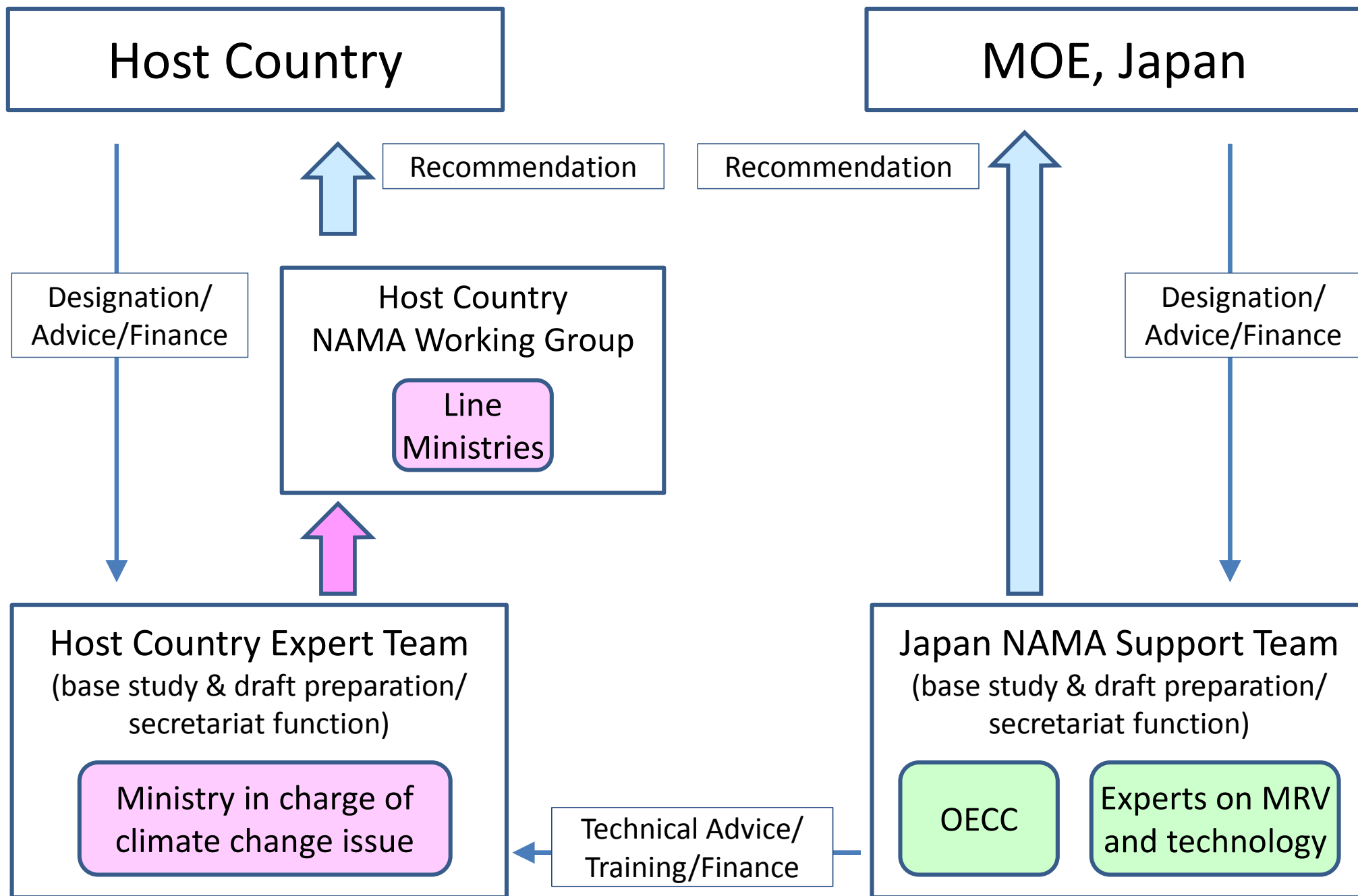
# Background of Joint Activities



- The Japanese government supports developing countries in their efforts to mitigate the effects of climate change, through several initiatives such as 1) capacity building for NAMAs, and 2) introduction of the Joint Crediting Mechanism (JCM).
- In the case of NAMAs, 4 host countries (Cambodia, Lao PDR, Mongolia, and Vietnam) and the Ministry of the Environment, Japan (MOEJ), have decided to cooperate on capacity building and joint studies for the introduction of NAMAs in a MRV manner through the Overseas Environmental Cooperation Center, Japan (OECC) since FY2012.

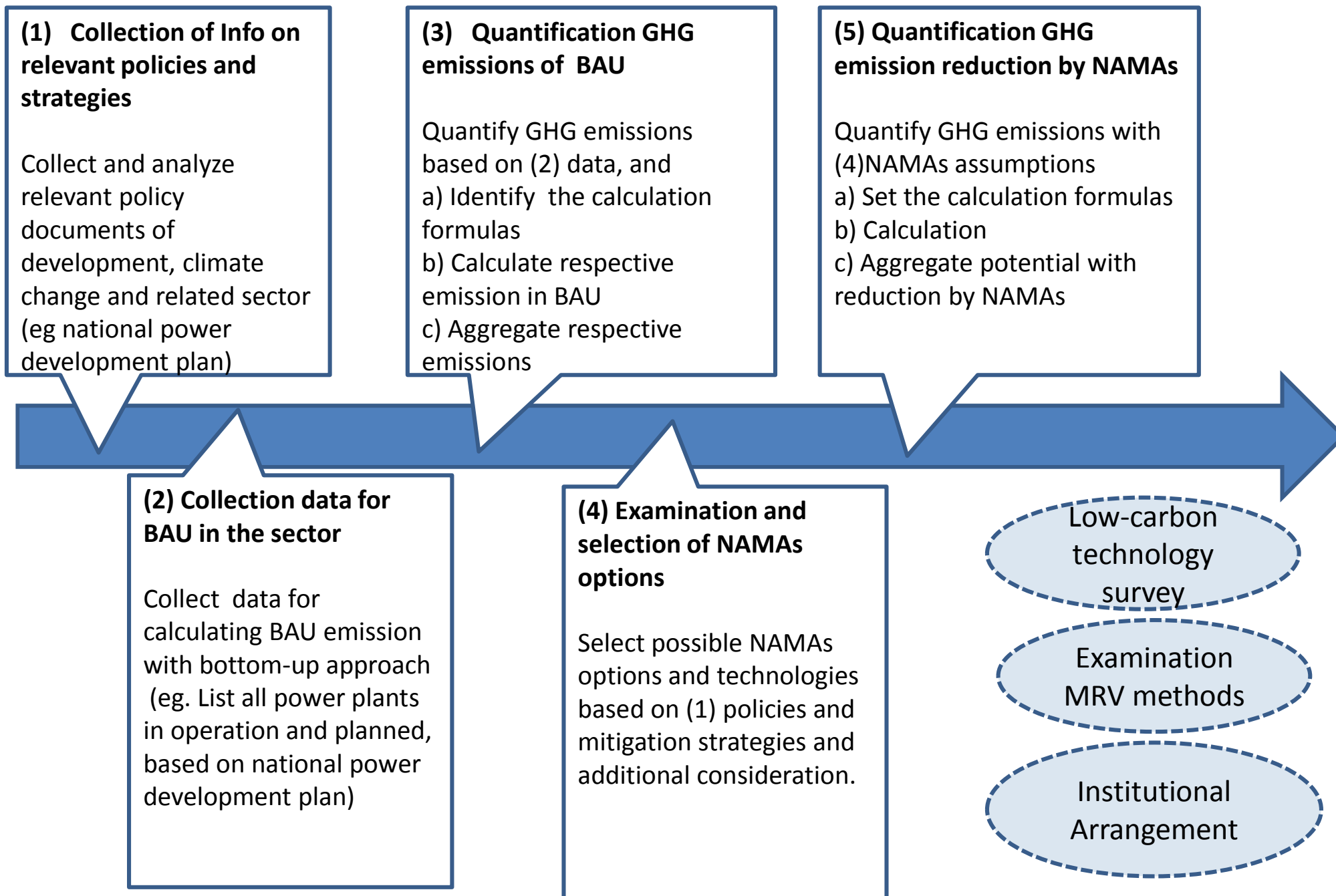

- Establishment of the cross-sectoral NAMAs working group is useful in order to gain consensus to develop NAMAs.
- Data collection is the challenge for most countries, however establishment of the country specific default value will be useful for GHG emissions quantification of NAMAs options.
- Consideration of financial schemes to be utilized for NAMAs implementation is essential.

**About JCM**

- Proposed Elements of the Joint Crediting Mechanism (JCM)
- To facilitate diffusion of leading low carbon technologies, products, systems, services, and infrastructure as well as implementation of mitigation actions, and contributing to sustainable development of developing countries.
- To appropriately evaluate contributions to GHG emission reductions or removals from developed countries in a quantitative manner, through mitigation actions implemented in developing countries and use those emission reductions or removals to achieve emission reduction targets of the developed countries.
- To contribute to the ultimate objective of the UNFCCC by facilitating global actions for emission reductions or removals.

**Japan** (Used to achieve Japan's emission reduction target) → Leading Low Carbon Technologies, etc. and implementation of mitigation actions → **Host Country** (JCM Project) → MRV → GHG emission reductions / removals → Credits → Japan

MRV Methodologies will be developed by the Joint Committee
